I want to update you on the results of my "Time to Talk about Immigration in Sandwell" survey. I also want to say thank you for giving your time to think about this important issue.

More surveys were returned than on any other subject I have asked you about in the past. This shows that not only do local people want to talk about immigration they want people to know how it impacts on them, their family and the community they live in.

Many people told me they were concerned about the level of immigration here in Sandwell. There is a great deal of worry about the pressure on schools, doctor's surgeries and housing allocations. Also unsurprisingly, a lot of people also mentioned the issue of protecting local jobs.

There was also massive support for a probationary period before being allowed to claim benefits; the introduction of the Australian style points system to ensure people coming to this country have the skills we need and an ability to speak English or learn it.

I met with our Immigration Minister to pass on your views.

Most of the suggestions that you supported are now law. More legal changes will come into effect soon.

Over the coming weeks I want you to help me to keep the pressure up on the Government in relation to reforming and updating our immigration and citizenship rules and laws. Like you I want to see radical changes.
